LOOKING FORWARD

As you can imagine, it's been a challenging year, but also interesting and very rewarding. While visits to our pantries have leveled off from the early pandemic high, demand remains steady at each of Neighborhood Food Pantries' six locations. Rising grocery and fuel prices have created additional hardship for local families. They have

also increased our costs, from the food we purchase from Northern Illinois Food Bank to operating our vans for our food recovery program.

We distributed a record 3 million pounds of food – or 2.5 million meals – to local families in our last fiscal year. Our food recovery program, partnering with local grocery stores, continued to grow both in total pounds recovered and the percentage of overall food distributed. These tremendous partnerships keep our cost per pound of food at a remarkably low 4.4 cents per pound.

We were excited to host both of our signature events, the Shopping Cart Shuffle and HarvestFest, in person this year, with a strong turnout at both events. We hope that in 2022 even more of you will be able to join us!

And we unveiled a new, updated website to better communicate our mission and reach more people in need of our services.

Our board has volunteered their time and talents to form new committees to strengthen every aspect of our operations. They are working with staff and volunteers to establish best practices throughout our pantries. They are reviewing our programs to ensure that our outstanding volunteers know how much we value their contributions. They are reaching out to thank donors and let them know how their support is making a difference. And they are working to increase awareness of our programs throughout the community.

We are ready and excited to take on 2022 and whatever it brings. We are always looking for friendly faces with new ideas at our pantries, on our special event committees, or with special projects throughout the year. 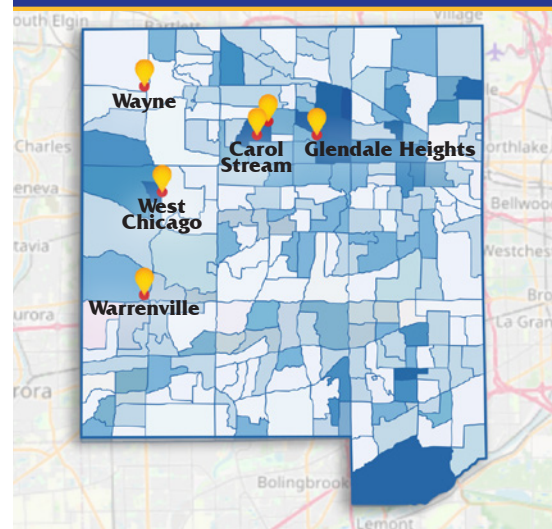

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVANT AWARDS

Our 2021 Neighborhood Servant Awards were presented to one individual and two organizations whose generosity and service has displayed extraordinary dedication and service to their neighbors in need.

The DuPage Foundation | Snodgrass Family Fund of the DuPage Foundation

The DuPage Foundation is a long-time supporter of our mission. Their grants have funded our Food Recovery program, providing funding for refrigeration units and cargo vans. Since 2019 the Snodgrass Family Fund of the DuPage Foundation has chosen to support our pantries, funding grants for multiple van and refrigeration projects.

Together these two entities have funded more than \$150,000, truly representing Neighborhood Servants.

Marina Mattingly

Marina Mattingly brings boundless energy, compassion, and dedication for our mission to her service. She is a past president of Carol Stream's Rotary Club, a founding member of our Women of Impact Group, and a volunteer food recovery driver for our pantry in West Chicago. Over the past 18 months, she has TWICE combined her roles at Rotary and volunteer leader of our Women of Impact group to combine forces and raise nearly \$20K. She has directed volunteer service support from both individuals and Rotary Clubs members, and has brought new supporters to our mission from local businesses.

LIFETIME SERVANT AWARDS

For the first time this year, we awarded four LIFETIME Servant Awards to an individual and three organizations whose support has been steadfast over the lifetime of our organization.

In 1999 **St. Isidore Parish, Resurrection Catholic Church, and Lutheran Church of the Master** came together to form Northwest DuPage Walk-In Ministries (now Neighborhood Food Pantries) to better address food insecurity in the community – churches and the community coming together to provide services close to home. Together they provide generous support, whether donating space that hosts our pantries, providing volunteers to serve our guests, holding collections for special event drives, participating in our fundraising events, or providing monetary support of our mission.

Ed Schwab served as our Board Treasurer from 2004 to 2019, at the same time participating in our Administrative Committee and as our accountant (at no cost) until he retired from the board in November 2019. 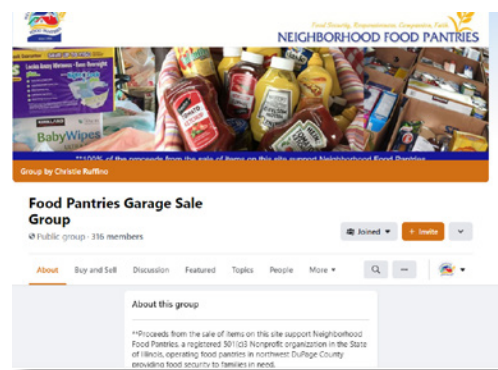

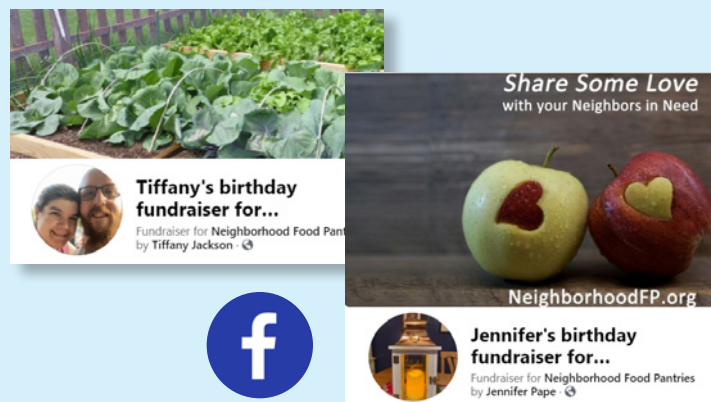

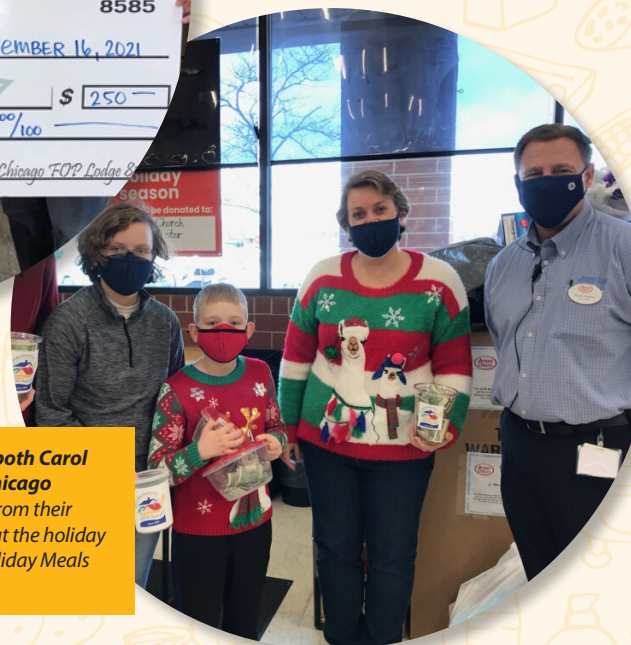
Cassidy Tire & Service, collected 1,236 pounds of food from their customers in May 2021 – each customer who brought in a donation to our pantries received a discount on their services!
