When I joined Neighborhood Food Pantries last December, I never dreamed I would be working with this team to operate our pantries during a pandemic. As you can imagine, it has been a very challenging time.

Because of our volunteers and staff's dedication, we kept our pantries open throughout the pandemic. And generous donors have enabled us to keep our shelves filled, despite increased demand.



I am incredibly proud of what our team has accomplished this year. Our pantry coordinators and volunteers quickly adopted strict safety protocols and pivoted to "curb-side" pre-packaged service. They established health certification procedures to ensure that pantry guests, volunteers, and staff are SAFE during these times. Most importantly, they have shown up at the pantries each and every day to ensure that local families receive the food they need.

Last year our team distributed a record 2.6 million pounds of food – or 2.2 million meals for local families. Your generosity and dedication to serving neighbors in need motivate us every day, and we could not succeed without each of you.

Our special events team faced challenges as well. Both our 5K and HarvestFest dinner/auction had to convert to virtual events. And our dedicated supporters came through for our neighbors in need, participating in small groups to walk or run our 5K and joining together as part of our HarvestFest "Ultimate Tailgate" in November.

Finally, I want to recognize our Board of Directors, who has remained steadfast through it all. Whether driving our vans for food recovery, writing grant proposals, calling to thank donors, supporting our special events, or representing us in the community, you are truly the heart of our organization!

Thank you to all of you who support our mission, and our pantries, this and every year. THANK YOU all for your unwavering dedication!

This past year brought a lot of changes within our organization. As we shared last year, our Executive Director and Founder, Tom Norton, retired last November. We were fortunate to hire Kate Monteleone as our new Executive Director, who brings a fresh perspective and a wealth of non-profit experience to the job. Her expertise and leadership have brought new ideas to guide our team during this most unusual year.

Our new pantry in West Chicago opened in October 2019. Since opening, the average number of households served in West Chicago increased by approximately 25%, BEFORE the impact of the pandemic set in.

The opening of the West Chicago facility brought another significant change for us. After 'officing' in space generously donated by St. Isidore over the past 20 years, we have relocated our operations to our own dedicated space within this new building.

Our location in Glendale Heights, which was serving 50 households per month in 2018 as a mobile site, is now serving more than 300 families on average each month.

And we are excited to share that we have just added our newest pantry location at Bloomingdale Church. We have more about this new location on page 5. We hope you will let others know about this location, whether they are looking to serve local families or need support.

Finally, I want to take a moment to thank and introduce several new board members. Mike Neville joined our board last January, accepting the Treasurer's position, bringing 40 years of logistics, operational accounting, and financial systems integration experience to our team. Kelly Cummings, a long-term supporter and inaugural member of our Women of Impact group, joined our board in September. John Pappanduros, another long-term supporter and 2018 recipient of our Neighborhood Servant Award, joined the board in December. We are excited to welcome them all to the team!

Thank you all so much for your support! I am very moved by the tremendous support provided by individual donors and grant providers during the pandemic. You are essential to carrying out NFP's core mission, which is providing efficient food distribution to people in need in northern DuPage County.

INTRODUCING OUR NEWEST LOCATION

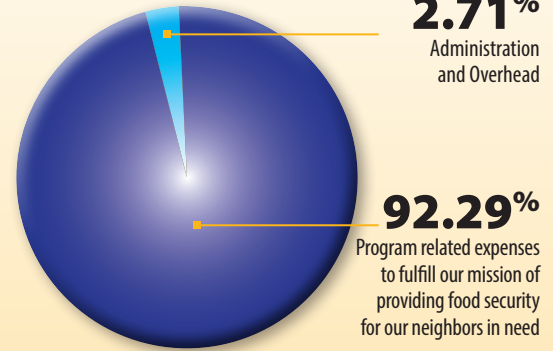
We are excited to announce our newest pantry location at Bloomingdale Church.

Spearheading our effort there is Judi Waters, pantry coordinator, assisted by an amazing group of volunteers. Located at 260 Glen Ellyn Rd in Bloomingdale (under the portico at the back of the church), this pantry is open every Wednesday from 12 – 2pm, providing drive-thru service to local residents. Since joining our network of pantries, we have secured a grant from Northern Illinois Food Bank for refrigeration units to provide pantry guests with fresh, nutritious foods. We are excited to be able to serve more local families every week with this new pantry!

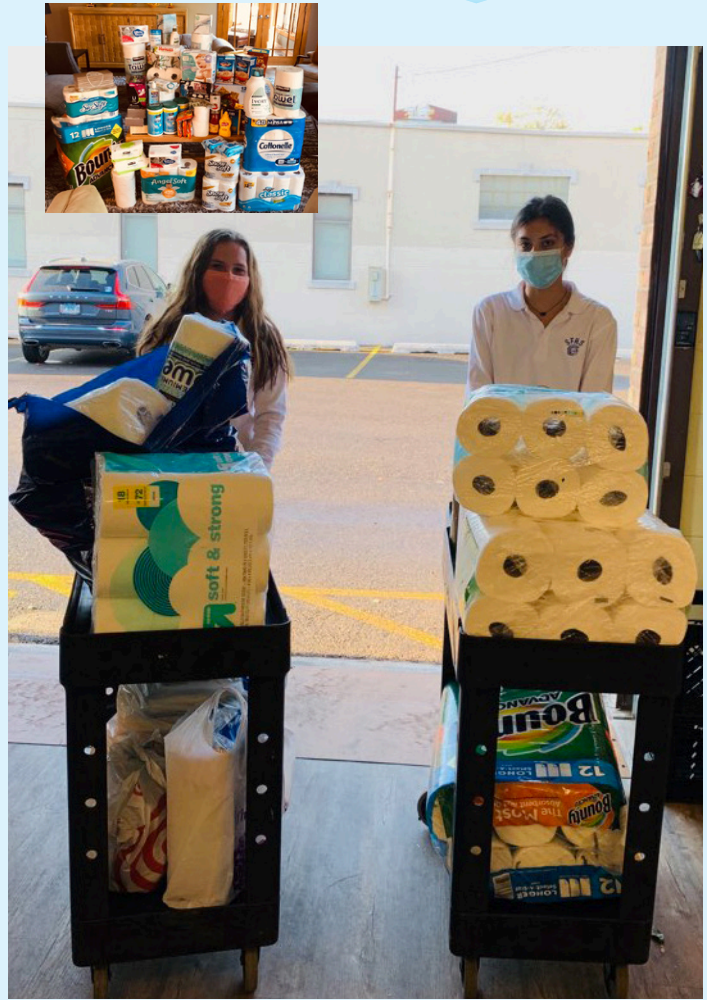
GET YOUR SCHOOL INVOLVED

INDIVIDUAL FUNDRAISERS

This year brought out the dedication and generosity of our supporters in so many ways. In addition to collection drives, individual donations, and volunteering, you found creative ways to fundraise to help feed local families.

Michelle Tran and her son Ethan Ho created an Etsy store of handmade masks, with all sales benefitting Neighborhood Food Pantries. Choices include DESIGNER styles (handmade from Authentic Designer Handbag Dust Bags) and Breathable Fashion Cotton and Cotton Blend Fabrics, such as their Chicago collection, holiday styles as well as traditional solid color masks. In total they raised more than \$3,500 to feed their neighbors!



When the 2020 Big Sur International Marathon was cancelled, **Chuck King** didn't want all his training to go to waste, so he changed his focus. Although he had never fundraised before, he set a goal of \$2,620, representing the 26.2 miles of the marathon. He mapped out his route locally, and ran a full marathon along local streets.



In total, Chuck exceeded his goal and raised more than \$2,700 in support of local families!

Brandon Macias took up Edward Jones "Creative Cuts" challenge, raising \$820 from friends and family to support our pantries. Two months into lockdown, he agreed to have his wife, or possibly his 4-year-old son, cut his hair. The resulting haircut would depend on how much was raised. Had he reached \$10,000 he would have rocked a "George Costanza" 'do' for a week!



Christie Ruffino, Founder and President of the Dynamic Professional Women's Network, has been selling items on Facebook Marketplace with proceeds benefitting Neighborhood Food Pantries. Over the past several years she has sold tables, shelving, rugs and more (most are brand new items returned to local stores), raising tens of thousands of dollars to help fill our pantry shelves!
