I AM GRATEFUL TO ALL OF YOU

I am a registered nurse, with more than 37 years of experience. And 6 months ago I became a guest of your food pantry at Resurrection Church in Wayne.

As an ER and urgent care nurse, I've seen a lot of hardship come through our care centers. I've met seniors who are sharing their medications because they can't afford to purchase meds for both of them. I've worked with single moms who are licensed med-techs trying to support their family on \$10 an hour (sometimes I would slip a \$20 bill into their pocket when they weren't looking). I've seen patients who use the ER as their primary care center because they can't afford to buy health insurance and feed their families. But as a licensed nurse, eager to work, I never expected that I would find myself seeking help at a food pantry.

12 years ago, the hospital I was working at made a strategic change, eliminating their full-time ER nurses, opting instead to hire staff on a part-time, contract basis, which meant less money and no benefits. At the time I was fortunate to find another job at a different hospital nearby, but 5 years ago that hospital went through the same restructuring, and I again found myself looking for permanent work. Since then I have worked a variety of temporary or part-time jobs to make sure that I can pay my mortgage and keep my car running to get to work.

I am fortunate to have good friends. My friend Kevin, who is fully aware of my situation, stops by and makes sure that I am eating more than peanut butter, and sometimes brings food for my cats. Kevin is actually a volunteer at the pantry at Resurrection, and was the person who convinced me to come and get food from your pantry.

I was nervous to come in. I expected people to feel sorry for me, "oh poor you", etc. Instead, I found a group of compassionate volunteers who made me feel comfortable and get the assistance I needed without feeling ashamed or guilty. I was surprised by the other guests I saw – so many were people just like me. Seniors who can't afford to live off social security alone. Able-bodied adults who WANT to work but can't find a good-paying job. Moms who just want to do the best for their children,

I recently finished a 6-week contract that was supposed to have lasted 8-12 weeks. As I look for work I find job postings where 240+ people have viewed most job listings. They say that unemployment is low, but my field is full of people taking part-time contract work without benefits. I am ready, willing and able to work, but the jobs aren't there.

You might be surprised to learn that I am 72 years old. I am fortunate enough to still be able to work – many my age are not so lucky. Social Security is not enough to pay the bills, and with 'hit-or-miss' job opportunities for so many years, saving for retirement has not been possible.

I am grateful to have friends who look out for me, and who directed me to your pantry. I am grateful for the volunteers who made me feel so welcome at a difficult time in my life. And I am grateful to all of you, who make it all possible.

Twenty years ago we started as three pantries, twelve partner churches, and a belief that we could work better together to make a difference for our neighbors in need. Today we are honored to partner with 30+ churches, 100+ local businesses and hundreds of individual donors to operate 6 pantries, serving more than 11,000 individuals throughout northwest DuPage County. We have grown from 6,200 visits to our pantries in our first year to more than 24,000 visits during our most recent fiscal year.

Since our humble start, we have:

- Overseen the construction of two free-standing pantries. One in West Chicago and another in Glendale Heights, as well as additions to our pantries in Warrenville and Carol Stream.
- Implemented a Nutritious Food Program focusing on distributing a higher percentage of the ChooseMyPlate.gov dietary guideline foods. This effort has led to over a 74% nutritious food distribution rate in fiscal 2018-2019.
- Purchased 5 cargo vans (with the support of generous grants from community partners).
- Joined the “Direct Connect” Food Recovery program (a partnership with local grocery retailers) through our relationship with the Northern Illinois Food Bank, which provides nutritious fruit, vegetables, meat, and other foods to our guests, at the same time keeping those items from ending up in a dumpster or a landfill.
- Engaged thousands of local volunteers and community organizations who share their time, talent and treasure to support local families in need.

As we look back on these 20 years, we also look to the future, as the need for our services continues to grow. We have implemented several new programs over the past year to aid in the level of support and assistance we can provide to our guests:

- Our Advisory Council, which began in 2018 and operates independently of the Board of Directors with a goal is to add value to NFP’s mission through their contacts, relationships, and ideas.
- Our Women of Impact initiative, which is a team with a passion for feeding our local neighbors in need. In their first year, they have provided funding for one month of food for our pantries, and two months of milk for local families with children.
- Our Monthly Giving program, which was ‘kicked-off’ with a matching donation sponsored by long-time supporters Michelle Tran and David Ho of Cameo Dentistry (who generously matched all new donations during June and July up to a total of \$10,000). Monthly donors provide a consistent cash flow to fund our mission to feed our neighbors.
- We are also planning to create a reserve and endowment fund in the next year. This program will initially create a reserve fund, to ensure ongoing operations, and over time will expand to fund capital projects and ultimately a full endowment fund.

On behalf of the entire staff, volunteers and board of directors, thank you for your support for our mission. If you are meeting us for the first time, we welcome your participation in bringing food security to our region!

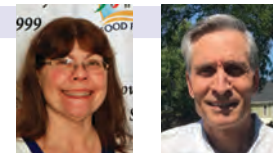

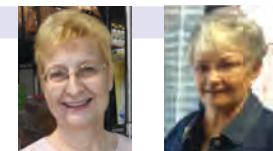

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVANT AWARDS

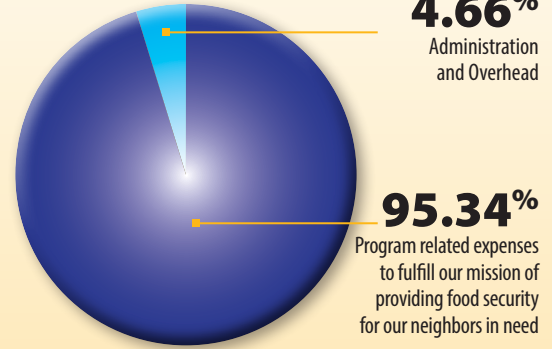
Our 2019 Neighborhood Servant Awards were presented to three churches whose generosity and service has displayed an extraordinary dedication and service to their neighbors in need.

Family In Faith Christian Church has partnered with NFP for many years to provide a mobile food pantry one Saturday per month year round. Their dream to build a permanent pantry became a reality last November, when they opened their brand new 2,400 square foot pantry last November.

1st Congregational Church, a longtime partner of NFP, now worshipping with 1st United Methodist, dedicated a significant portion of the proceeds from the sale of their building on Route 59 to building a food pantry in West Chicago. Their partnership with the Risch-Dieckmann Family Foundation made our new Fremont Food Pantry a reality.

By accepting the donation of the 123 Fremont building, **St. Michael's United Church of Christ** led the renovation of the new facility, and has accepted the responsibility of ownership and a new level partnership with NFP in the operation of the new pantry which will serve many more West Chicago families.

These congregations exemplify the heart and spirit of a true Neighborhood Servant. We thank them for the confidence they place in NFP to be the vehicle by which they feed those in need.

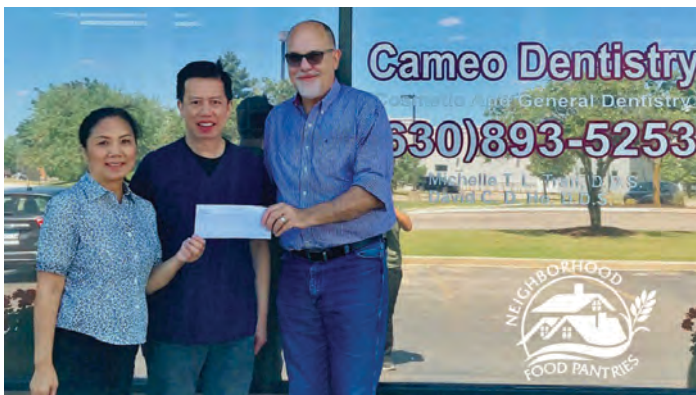

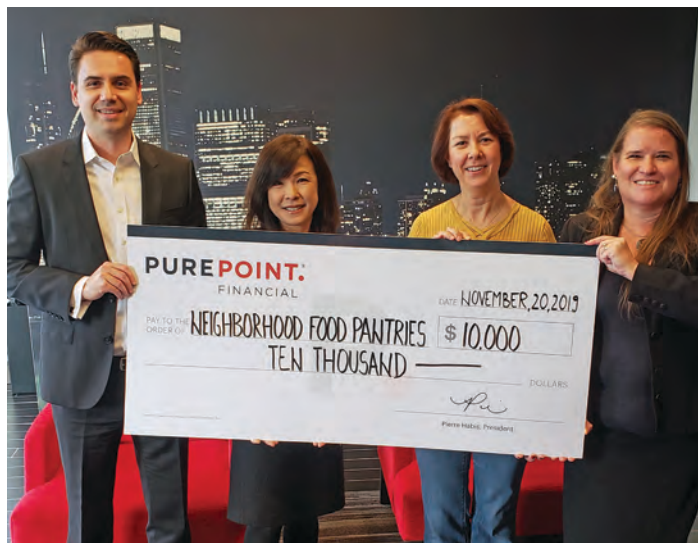
